Positions Open- Creel Clerks and Restoration Crew Members

Huron Pines currently has several seasonal positions (April-October) available and is accepting applications until the positions are filled.

Creel Clerks: Three are based in Mio on the Au Sable, where staff will be conducting interviews and collecting information for DNR resource management decisions. We're looking for people with the ability to work nights and weekends, work independently, operate a boat, have their own vehicle and have excellent personal communication skills. Forty hours per week, \$12/hr.

Restoration Crew: We are also seeking individuals with extensive experience in chainsaw operation and an interest in improving fisheries habitat on the Au Sable River. Applicants should be highly motivated and like to work outdoors, with some weekend work. Strong leadership skills and experience supervising a field crew preferred. Personal vehicle required. Position is based out of Grayling and involves working in the Roscommon and Mio areas. Forty hours per week, \$11-\$14/hr, depending on qualifications.
